36. Parishioner's Issues

A resident reported that 2 dead trees in Water lane are dangerous and require removal, and it had also been noticed that some young trees had been marked up — were these for felling?

18 volunteers helped with the Spring Clean. CDC removed the litter collected and also some fly tipped suitcases.

There was a discussion about the verge damage following works on the house at the top of water lane. It was suggested that it would be helpful if the owners could write a letter to the Clerk to the Parish council confirming that the verge would be re-instated when works have been completed.

142 trees have been planted by Viridor and residents of the village.

38. Minutes of the meeting of 9th January 2023

The Council agreed that the minutes of the meeting of the 9th January 2023 were an accurate record.

39. Progress on Parish matters

a) Strategic Railfreight Interchange.

Ongoing

The housing development at Bucknell is currently outside the extent of development proposed in the CDC Local Plan.

There is also concern at proposals to extend the development at Heyford Park by another 2000 houses.

b) Traffic issues and Vas update

The Chairman has meet with a representative of OCC highways, who has agreed to put forward proposals for traffic calming measures in the village, and has also noted the condition of the B430 at the traffic lights.

It was reported that the VAS on the B430 is now working, although it cannot be seen when entering the village from the direction of the motorway.

c) Green/environmental issues

It was suggested that the Forestry commission may support the development of coppice training at Ardley woods. More details are to be obtained.

d) Viridor

Notes of the recent liaison meeting will be circulated. There was concern that lorries that were inadequately sheeted were depositing litter on the adjacent highway verges and around the site. The Clerk was asked to refer the matter to OCC planning.

e) MCNP

The Clerk was asked to send details of the Parish council contacts on the MCNP to the Chairman of the plan Committee.

Village hall/playing field

There are rumours of proposed development proposals for the football field. The Parish council agreed to delay discussion until these were forthcoming.

Cllr Mills agreed to raise the possibility of a shed to house resilience equipment with the Village Hall Committee.

Coronation celebrations

The Parish council agreed to make a grant of up to £500 to the committee organising the Coronation celebrations on the weekend of 6th May.
