The Chairman referred to the following key village projects over the past year:-

a) Strategic Railfreight Interchange.

There will be a public consultation event on proposals for a Strategic Railfreight interchange in the Village Hall on 14<sup>th</sup> May. Should permission be granted the Parish Council would want to see substantial support for the local community, including recognition that road links needed to be maintained and enhanced, an upgrade to junction 10 of the M40 and conditions limiting the effects of lighting and noise.

- b) Traffic issues and Vas update The new VAS is working well.
- c) Jubilee celebrations
  The parish will be celebrating the Jubilee, with details of events circulated shortly. These will include children's games, fireworks a beacon and bunting.
- d) Green/Environmental issues. The Clerk was asked to request new signage for the footpaths around the Parish, as routes are not clear, and walkers are sometimes damaging crops unnecessarily.
