Minutes of the Ardley with Fewcott Parish Council on Monday 14th July 2025 in the Norman Fraser Room of the Village Hall.

10. Declarations of interest

Cllr Jenkins declared a personal interest in the proposed development by Puy de Fou in Bucknell and took no part in any later discussion.

11. Parishioner's Issues

There was concern that the drains on the B430 were blocked, It was agreed that the problem should be added to "Fix my Street" and details sent separately to Cllr Butcher Giles.

There was also a report of an overgrown hedge near the last property leaving the village on the B430, which the Clerk will also report.

The Clerk confirmed that the defibrillator outside the White Lion PH was registered on "The Circuit". It was agreed that any consumables required for the defibrillator would be supplied by the Parish Council.

IT was reported that there was increased traffic along Water Lane and Somerton Roads, possibly looking to access Soho Farm. The chairman confirmed that the Parish Council were working with Somerton council on a traffic calming scheme.

Residents attending the meeting explained the concept of "leaky dams" to distribute water in the event of flooding. The Parish Council agreed to support the proposals, and to set up an informal working group to investigate options, to include both residents and Cllr Hazelwonder.

He noted the Parish council's view that improvements to infrastructure provision should be completed before any additional development, and that recognition should be given to avoiding any light pollution.

Residents agreed to send him details of the blocked drains, and also the correspondence relating to traffic calming works to be provided out of S106 monies.

The Parish Council agreed to purchase 2 new solar powered "VAS" signs for the village.

The Parish Council agreed to support the Village Festival to be held on the Sports Field in September.
